- Yes, political conflict. But bigger, structural issues too.
- Education is a key difference.
- Investment levels critically important, but outcomes matter.
- Attainment, but also the value of education in the economy.


% of UK Average

All Island Economy 1920-2000

- NI fares better than IFS/ROI, but still large gap with GB.
- Pre-war NI industrial policy plagued by rent-seeking. Political interference with grants etc.
- Change of policy in 1960s led to improvement but then overtaken by conflict from 1970 onward.
- ROI loses out of Europe's golden age of growth 1950-70.
- Opening up from 1960, but balance of payments crises and lingering protectionism prevented sustained growth.
- EEC membership broke this trend.



All Island Economy 1997-2007

- Supposedly NI's golden decade, but only just about holds its own.
- ROI, Significant influx of FDI, recovery of US economy in mid 90s.
- Celtic Tiger up until ~2002, then domestic fuelled growth culminating in financial crises.

Financial Crises


- Growth hit both north and south, but south takes bigger hit, particularly on unemployment.
- ROI long term trend growth returns.
- NI experiences a dip, then declines.
- ROI big uplift in growth in 2015, requires closer look.

Economic Performance on the island of Island






Output North, South and EU15






Output North and South (foreign and domestic)

Output North and South (domestic)




Where we are

- Failure to make structural changes necessary education key to this.


Education Spending (per pop.)



Adjusted Education Spending




Adjusted Education Spending




Investment

- What does this level of investment get us?


Educational Attainment (age 15-64)




Below Secondary NI (age 15-64)




Educational Attainment (age 25-64)
