Workshops

1. Communication for Leaders - The 'X' & 'Y' Factors - Dr John White, DCU

Examining how leaders communicate including 'active listening', presenting and non-verbal communication. It endeavours to 'audit' and 'equip' participants with 'communication awareness' to increase their efficacy as communicators.

2. Leading DEIS Planning Through Distributed Leadership - Adrienne Darby & Kate Liston, Oide

This workshop is suitable for all DEIS school contexts. It will focus on: sustainable leadership approaches to the DEIS planning process; effective leadership practices for the SSE process in relation to DEIS planning, and how school leaders can keep this process manageable and impactful.

3. Hip Psychology - Cormac Venney

A workshop to get to the core of what resilience is and how to embed it within your school culture. It will

explore techniques to enhance resilience by integrating research with examples of best practices.

4. Defining Success in an Inclusive School - Dr Katriona O'Sullivan

An interactive workshop to examine the role of equity, inclusivity and social justice in schools. It will explore the role of leadership in building a positive school culture. Participants will consider how schools define success and its impact upon inclusion.

5. Developing Relationship Skills through our Emotional Intelligence and Coaching Skills - Jennifer Barron

This workshop will focus on one of the competencies in the *Emotional Capital Report* - relationship skills. The skills of listening, building rapport and being non-judgemental will be explored. When these skills are developed and strengthened in leaders they help drive an effective team.

6. Lessons from the Small Schools Cluster Project - Mary Curley, Marion Fahey & David Brennan

The experiences of one of the clusters participating in the *Small Schools Cluster Research Project*. The aim of the project is to explore improving the sustainability of small schools, through working in clusters.

7. The SER Process, a Methodology of Consultation & Review; NCSE Developments & Strategic Direction - John Kearney & Helen Walsh, NCSE

This workshop presents a new methodology by the NCSE in working with schools to meet the care needs of students. This represents a shift in NCSE engagement with the diverse voices of school leaders and stakeholders in meeting the complex needs of pupils with additional needs.
